


Andrews Study Bible — 3:14 God's self-revelation of His name focuses on being and existence, not particular characteristics. Grammatically, the phrase can be translated in a present ("I am that I am") as well as a future sense ("I will be whatever I will be"). It links to the promise of God's presence in v. 12. Divine presence (not merely existence) may be the most important aspect in this particular context. Moses and Israel are concerned about the God who—apparently—had been silent for a long period. The English word "Lord" is based on four Hebrew consonant letters, whose possible pronunciation was "Yahweh." Jewish scribes considered it so holy that they did not include the vowels of the word for "Lord," in order to avoid saying God's name. A close relationship exists between these four letters and the verb "to be."

And after the plagues, the Exodus, Red Sea, reception of the law and the tabernacle design, the people rebelled by worshipping the golden calf. Moses intercedes, and people still die by a plague as a result of their sin, but a key prayer of Moses bears reflection - "On the next day Moses said to the people, "You yourselves have committed a great sin; and now I am going up to the LORD, perhaps I can make atonement for your sin." Then Moses returned to the LORD, and said, "Alas, this people has committed a great sin, and they have made a god of gold for themselves. "But now, if You will, forgive their sin — and if not, please blot me out from Your book which You have written!" The LORD said to Moses, "Whoever has sinned against Me, I will blot him out of My book. "But go now, lead the people where I told you. Behold, My angel shall go before you; nevertheless in the day when I punish, I will punish them for their sin." Then the LORD smote the people, because of what they did with the calf which Aaron had made."

(Exodus 32:30-35 NAS95)

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


Concept: This scene of glory for Moses can prophetically point to the fulfillment of the promise of the second coming! With all of the elements mentioned here, God descending on a cloud, Moses calling upon God's name and the characteristics of God redeeming the righteous and punishing the wicked, the second coming is foretold in this story typologically.

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


Jesus' declaration regarding His Father's name in the Lord's Prayer:

""Pray, then, in this way: 'Our Father who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name." (Matthew 6:9 NAS95)

ASB - 6:9 Our Father. The use of "our" (and the use of plural pronouns throughout) demonstrates that Jesus is not against public prayer (see verses above). The Lord's Prayer is intended to be a public prayer. The intimate address, "Father" (translation from Abba, "daddy"), indicates the personal relation with God that is prevalent in the NT. But the phrase in heaven and subsequent language about hallowed be Your name and the coming of the kingdom speak to the majesty and otherness of God. God is both near us and approachable and at the same time majestically beyond us.

 "This name is hallowed by the angels of heaven, by the inhabitants of unfallen worlds. When you pray, "Hallowed be Thy name," you ask that it may be hallowed in this world, hallowed in you."

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


God's Name in Revelation
