

Sermon for May 16, 2020 Sacramento Woodside SDA Church Pr. Vincent Saunders, Jr., M.Div.

It happened in Lodi in March, a church gathered for worship after the Governor of California issued a stay-at-home order. During the service, the police entered and disbanded the gathering. And this case reveals the real tension within this current crisis. "Are churches essential?" Recently the case was ruled on by a federal judge who upheld the governor's authority to close religious gatherings.

Hurt and pain are situations that can often make a person wish for the alternative, death! There are stories of amputees, or survivors of accidents who grieve the loss of their limb or their loved one and hurt so badly that they wish that they themselves had lost their life!

Let's consider for a moment, the black death plague of Europe in the 14th century.


The black death was also known as "the great mortality", "the great pestilence" & "Blue Sickness" in England, and struck a Europe that was for the most part Christian (Catholic), agrarian and feudal (bonds of service, support, loyalty, protection & hierarchy).

Question: Will the same be said of COVID-19 pandemic of 2020 in 600 years should the Lord delay?



It was so bad that funeral rights that were scheduled for one bier bearer would have a following of two or three biers with multiple family members on each cart. When the cemeteries filled up, trenches were dug on church grounds to accommodate the burials.

One recent story of a mortuary overflowing to capacity and resorting to rented trucks gives us relevance.



It is when we are experiencing pain, loss, grief, & instability that doubts arise about the character of God, His will, and plan for our lives personally!

It's hard to fathom, but pain is actually a gift, without it we would not realize that something is terribly wrong. It's true of symptoms in our bodies, our emotions, and our humanity.


In these times, the temptation to distrust God becomes great, and I fear that is the biggest challenge to humanity during crises like this.




What does the Bible say about the current state of affairs of the world? Does it have answers to our questions of pain, suffering, and death?




A timeline for the greatest outbreak in the universe is hard to determine, but we do know one thing: "God saw all that He had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day." (Genesis 1:31 NAS95)

Earth was created without a single blight! Not even a microscopic germ or virus! Hard to imagine, isn't it!

"Nevertheless death reigned from Adam until Moses, even over those who had not sinned in the likeness of the offense of Adam, who is a type of Him who was to come. The biblical record is filled with pain, suffering, and death of God's people, and the result of that fall is evident today. And the law of causality is at work...

When God gave His promises through Moses before the Israelites entered the promised land, He also gave the root cause of suffering and pain:

- DRD your God, to observe to do all His commandments and His statutes with which I charge you today, that all these curses will come upon you and overtake you:
- > "Cursed shall you be in the city, and cursed shall you be in the country." (Deuteronomy 28:15–16 NAS95)



The cause of suffering led to the effect of ultimate suffering! ""Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends. "You are My friends if you do what I command you. "No longer do I call you slaves, for the slave does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I have heard from My Father I have made known to you." (John 15:13–15 NAS95)



The biblical record of humanity's struggles helps us to see our need of a solution outside of our capabilities.

"Doctors are working around the clock to bring COVID-19 under control.

Government leaders are working to bring our way of life under control.

Entrepreneurs and other culture creators are working to bring the economy under control.




## Endurance through Pain
