

Incense - Prayer



Plan of the Ark of the Covenant - Exodus 25:10-22

The ark was a rectangular box (' \bar{a} rôn) made of acacia wood, and measured $2\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$

ITEMS OF THE ARK

- Mercy Seat "propitiation" as in "Yom Kippur" -Solid Gold, no wood insert
- ♦ Kippur "atonement"
- Shekinah Glory "Shekinah means the presence or nearness of God to His people."

Mercy Seat - "propitiation" - as in "Yom Kippur" - Solid Gold, no wood insert!

Kāpar; a primitive root; to cover (specifically with bitumen); figuratively, to expiate or condone, to placate or cancel: — appease, make (an atonement, cleanse, disannul, forgive, be merciful, pacify, pardon, purge (away), put off, (make) reconcile(-liation).

Manna - Never Spoiled



SDABC - The ark and the mercy seat constituted the very heart of the sanctuary. Above the mercy seat was the Shekinah, the symbol of the divine presence. The tables of the law within the ark testified to the fact that God's kingdom is founded on an immutable standard of righteousness (Ps. 97:2), which even divine grace must respect. Grace cannot be dispensed on terms which "make void the law" (Rom. 3:31). When sin is pardoned, the law's claim against the sinner must also be satisfied. The very purpose of the gospel is to secure for the sinner the forgiveness of his sins, by faith in a means that does not "make void the law," but "establishes" it. While the tables within the ark testified against the people, the mercy seat pointed to a way in which the claims of the law could be met and the sinner saved from death, the penalty of the law. On the basis of law alone there can be no reunion between God and man, since sin separates us from Him (Isa. 59:1, 2). The blood-sprinkled mercy seat must intervene, for it is only on the ground of Christ's mediation on our behalf that we can draw near to God (Heb. 7:25). — SDA Bible Commentary on Ex. 25:10-22








UNAPPROACHABLE LIGHT





Bull for High Priest; goat for the people; Incense and blood "inside the veil" applied to the mercy seat and to the horns of the altar of Incense "For on that day the priest shall make atonement for you, to cleanse you, that you may be clean from all your sins before the LORD. It is a sabbath of solemn rest for you, and you shall afflict your souls. It is a statute forever." (Leviticus 16:30–31 NKJV)



For every high priest is appointed to offer both gifts and sacrifices. Therefore it is necessary that this One also have something to offer. 
Appeal Story: Ladder Plus Man's Body

The Sailor's Home, in Liverpool, was once on fire at night and a great cry of "Fire!" was raised. When the people assembled they saw in the upper stories some men crying for help.
